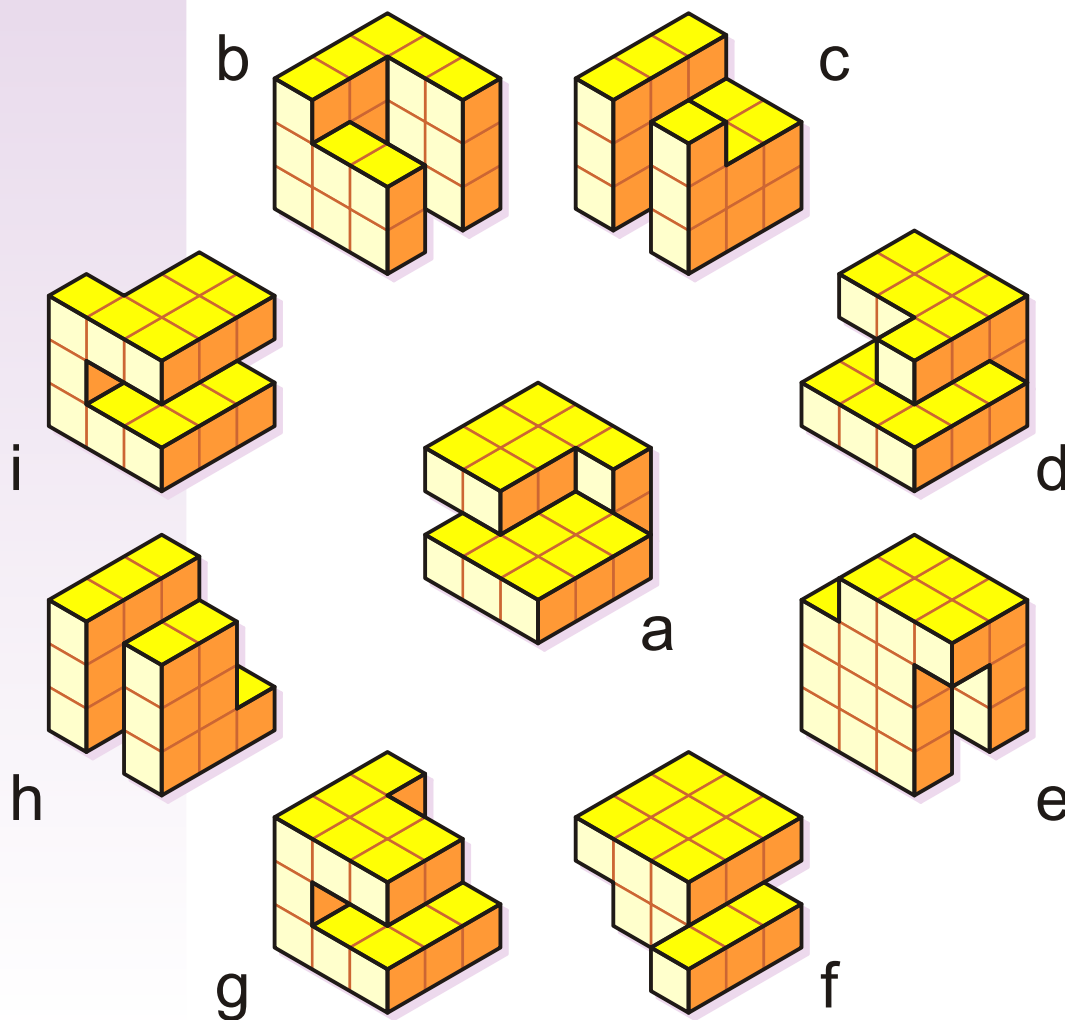

How many pairs are there? Which shapes make 'em?

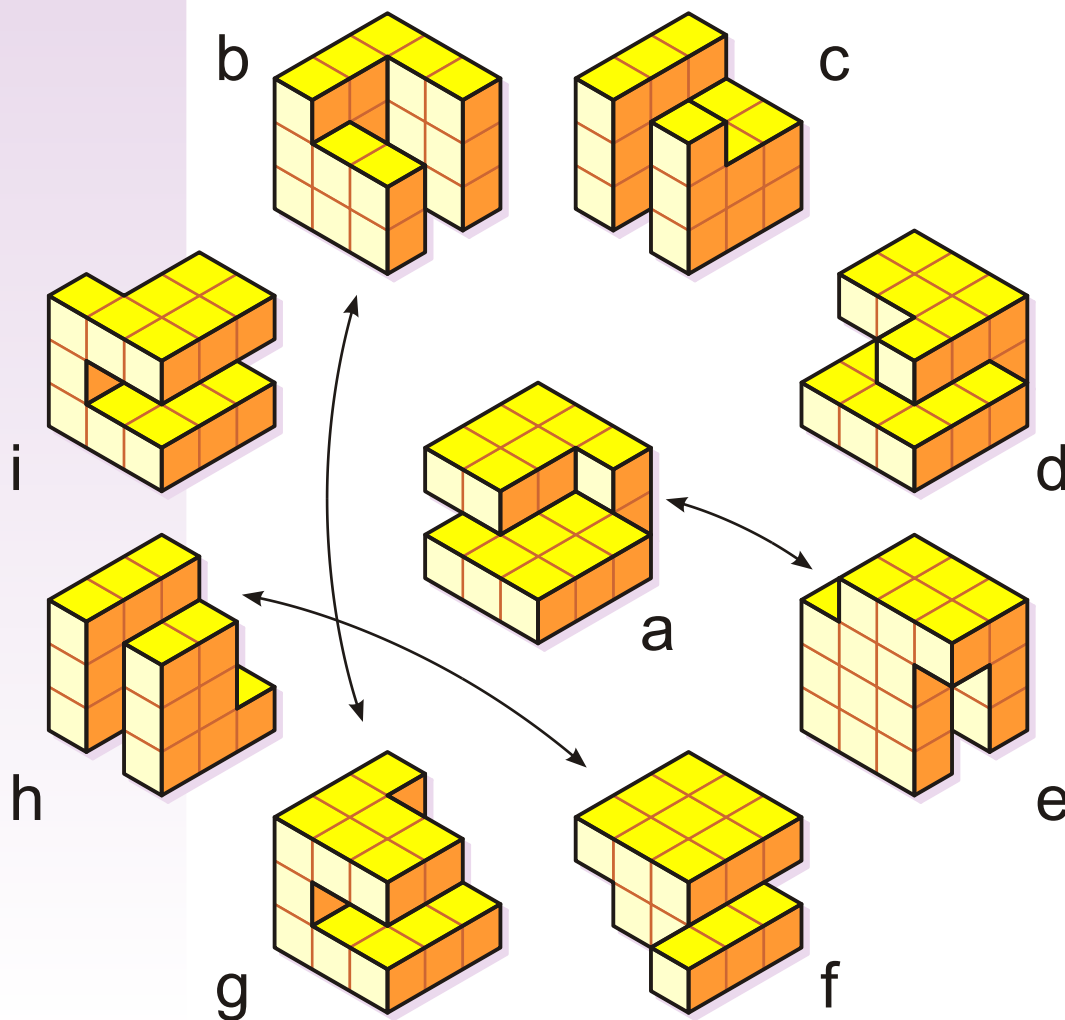
