Answer: Yes.

Here's how: Start by choosing a fish from the "carp-and-catfish" barrel. Since every barrel is incorrectly signed, you already know that this barrel cannot contain "carp-and-catfish"... it has to contain only one type of fish. Say you drag out a carp... you can then correctly place the carp label on this barrel. Next ask, what fish are in the barrel labeled "catfish"? They cannot be carp, and they can't be catfish either or the label would be correct. They must be "carp-and-catfish". The "carp" barrel, then, must contain the catfish. That clever Clarence!
